

ORDINANCE NO. 877-19

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 11 OF THE BRUSH MUNICIPAL CODE
BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE 5 ESTABLISHING RULES FOR THE PUBLIC
CAMPGROUND.**

Whereas, the city owns and operates a public campground located on South Clayton Street; and

Whereas, it has become necessary to formally adopt rules for the use of the campground, with penalties for the violation thereof; and

Whereas, the City Council finds and determines that such rules would be in the public interest.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRUSH AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 11 of the Brush Municipal Code is amended by the addition of a new Article 5 to establish rules for the use of the public campground, with violation for the violation thereof, as follows:

Article 5 Campground

Sec. 11-5-10. General application.

All campground rules apply to all visitors, tents, campers, trailers, motorhomes, and any other type of recreational vehicle (RV) utilizing the campground facility.

Sec. 11-5-20. Rules and regulations.

The use of the campground is subject to the following rules and regulations:

- a. All users must register for use and pay applicable daily fees. Registration must be completed and all applicable fees must be submitted either in advance, or at the onset of the stay.
- b. All users must complete registration permit form and submit applicable payment. The permit must be displayed and visible on the dashboard of the vehicle at all times. If there is no vehicle, then the permit must be attached to the tent or other shelter and visible at all times.

- c. The maximum stay in the campground is 7 days in a 30-day period.
- d. An extended stay is permissible by prior approval only by contacting City of Brush Recreation Department at 970-842-5280 for approval. Approval for an extended stay must be obtained at least five business days prior to the beginning of the stay.
- e. The speed limit in the campground is 10 mph.
- f. Animals must remain on leash at all times in the campground and adjoining park. Animal owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets. There is a dog park directly across the street from the campground.
- g. There shall be no dumping of grey or black waste except in dump station at the campground.
- h. All vehicles must be in the designated camp space.
- i. No go-carts, 3-wheelers or 4-wheelers may be operated in the campground. Motorcycles are only permitted for entering and exiting the campground.
- j. A maximum of 2 tents is permitted per group in each space.
- k. Fireworks are not permitted in the campground.
- l. The washing of vehicles and RVs is prohibited.
- m. No open flame campfires are permitted in the campground.
- n. No vehicle camping allowed; only specially designed camping apparatus (such as pick-up truck campers, RV's, camp trailers, tents, and the like) may be utilized within the campground.
- o. No more than two tents, or one RV and one tent is permitted per camp site.

- p. No more than two vehicles per campsite (not including towed camp trailers) is permitted per camp site.
- q. No livestock is permitted in the campground.
- r. No wet laundry may be dried, or hung outside of trailer or tent. Personal belongings (coolers, chairs, dog runs, bicycles, etc.) must be stored in or under vehicle, trailer or tent when not in use.
- s. Disruptive behavior consists of excessive noise, repeated violation of a rule within one day, or the violation of any law, federal, state or local. If the police are called by the management or another camper, due to disruptive behavior, the camper or campers may be immediately required to leave the campground. This includes extended stay campers, with the extension becoming void. There shall be no refunds to any person in this situation.

Sec. 11-5-30. Violations and Penalties.

- a. Violations of Section 1, Paragraphs A, B, and C shall be subject to a \$200 penalty per violation.
- b. Violations of Section 1, Paragraphs D through R shall be subject to a \$45 penalty per violation.
- c. Violators shall be issued a summons to the Brush Municipal Court for a violation. Each time (even within one day) a violation occurs is a separate offence.

Sec. 11-5-40. Campground Closures

The campground may be closed, with or without notice, at the discretion of the Brush Chief of Police, for up to 72 hours. Closures exceeding 72 hours must have approval of the City Administrator or Mayor. All occupants must vacate the campground if the campground is closed.
