Public Safety

Police Department – Police Chief Anderson

1. NIMS Training:
 - a. Can be obtained by registering with COTRAIN and doing online
 - b. Will need 100, 200, 700 and 800
2. Reports to Council:
 - a. Goal is to keep council informed of quality of life issues in the community, goals and objectives of the Police Department, and issues we are facing as a department and community.
 - b. Reports typically will include overall calls for service, significant events BPD has participated in, and global issues.
 - c. Things we cannot discuss is active cases or personnel issues.
 - d. We want to be transparent as much as possible within the limits of confidentiality and the law.
3. Interference in Investigations:
 - a. In order to ensure investigations are conducted without political influences, investigatory interference should not occur. Often times we know things that many others do not in these situations. Political influences can create many problems in any investigation (as we have seen at the federal level).
4. Active shooter training:
 - a. Society is changing; people are becoming more volatile and often see governmental officials as targets.
 - b. Council should be prepared to evacuate the chambers if an individual's becomes volatile or produces a weapon.
 - c. The mayor should strive to let the person know that they appear upset, and Council will go into recess for a brief time. The Mayor should have a key phrase or word to notify council members that it is time to move to a safer location. The location would be through the side door to the Police Department. Then out the back or down into the basement.
5. Annual Report:
 - a. A written annual report is typically provided to council in January of the ending year. The report identifies many areas of data designed to ensure that you have adequate information related to the organizations functions which occurred.
